# Amplified Sound Permits

Amplified Sound Permits allow the permittee to play amplified sound to 75 d(B)

A during hours prescribed by each permit type.

- Daily Permit Single-day only permit for amplified sound from 8 am - 10 pm.
- Extended Permit Multi-day events not to exceed five days from 8 am - 10 pm.
- Annual Permit A 12-month permit for non-Commercial Establishments; renews annually; allows use of amplified sound daily from 8 am - 10 pm (Sunday - Thursday) and 8 am - 11 pm (Friday -Saturday).
- Commercial Establishment Permit A 12-month permit; renews annually. Required for any commercial establishment that plays amplified sound from 8 am -10 pm (Sunday - Thursday) and 8 am -11 pm (Friday - Saturday). Also allows a Commercial Establishment to play amplified sound outdoors at 68 d(B)A from 10 pm - 2 am (Sunday - Thursday) and 11 pm - 2 am (Friday - Saturday).

# How can residents file noise/sound complaints?

Residents have several options to file a noise/sound complaint with the Houston Police Department:

## Chapter 30, Noise and Sound Regulation

On May 4, 2022, Houston City Council approved amendments to Chapter 30, Noise and Sound Regulations. These amendments are effective September 6, 2022.

## Summary of amendments:

- Create a Commercial Establishment Sound Permit.
- Increase the maximum citation fine to \$2,000.00
- Require that a permit be issued to an establishment, rather than an individual.
- Refine administrative hearing process for revocation of a permit.
- Codify regulations related to the issuance of a permit for a protest at a residential location.

#### Commercial Establishment Sound Permit

#### What is a Commercial Establishment?

A commercial establishment is any business entity that offers for sale or allows its patrons the ability to consume food or beverages or any combination thereof on its premises.

## What is a Commercial Establishment Sound Permit?

As of September 6, 2022, a Commercial Establishment Sound Permit will be required for any Commercial Establishment that wishes to play amplified sound outdoors or amplified sound appreciated outdoors within 300 feet of a residence. **Note**: Commercial Establishments are not allowed to play *any* outdoor amplified sound between 2:00 a.m. and 8:00 a.m.

## When will a commercial establishment need to obtain a commercial establishment permit?

A commercial establishment permit will be required as of September 6, 2022.

# If a restaurant or bar already has an annual permit, will it be required to obtain the new Commercial Establishment Permit?

If the annual permit is still active on 9/6/2022, the City of Houston will automatically convert the annual permit into a Commercial Establishment permit.

## How can a permit be suspended or revoked?

ARA will recommend suspension or revocation if the permittee:

- Fails to comply with any applicable provisions of Chapter 30; or
- Receives two or more convictions for violation of any of the provisions of Chapter 30 within a 36-month period.
