



# APRIL 2023



For the first time since calendar year 2015, BARC's save rate dropped below 80%. While foster, adoptions, and - for the first time this year - rescue numbers were higher than this time last year, intake also continues to increase. Close to 500 more animals were brought into the shelter in April 2023 than in April 2022, a 33.74% increase. The main source of intake continues to be from the field, reaching more than a 1,000 animals in April. However, BARC recently announced an expansion of public intake appointments, and this number nearly doubled from last month.

## 78% TOTAL SAVE RATE

Save Rate = The percentage of animals who leave the shelter through adoption, return to owner, transfers to other organizations, or other lifesaving program

It is important to note that while intake numbers continue to rise, the numbers are slightly behind pre-pandemic numbers. For example, in April 2019, total intake was 2,250. And, 1,605 of the April 2019 number were "Over the Counter" intakes, compared to 645 from the field. This means that after shifting to managed intake, most of the animals on our property are brought in by our enforcement team.

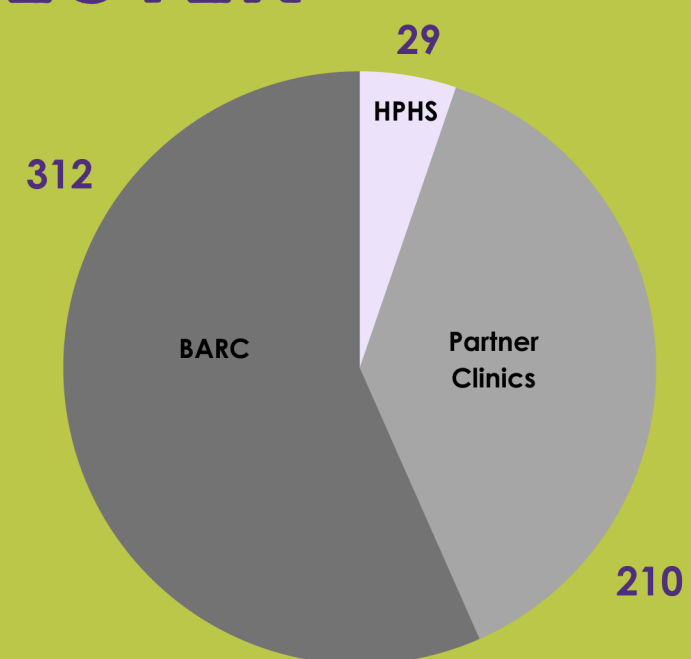

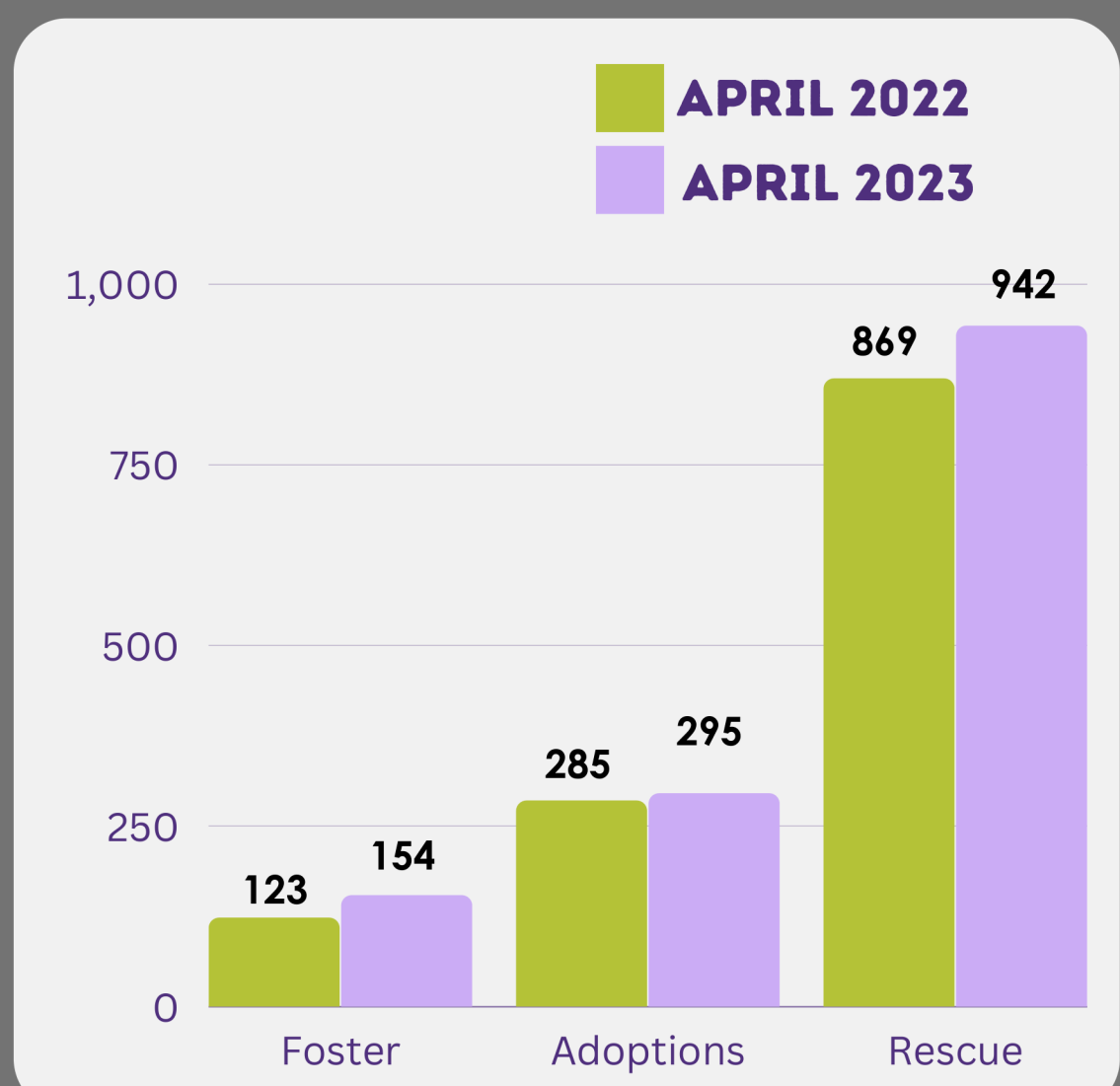
