




A Living Wage Crisis



17% of 2017 Houston ISD graduates overall earned a living wage in 2023. Pasadena ISD graduates were the most likely to earn a living wage at 24%.


Percent of Employed 2017 Graduates Earning a Living Wage Six Years After High School, by District

















70,000 more students walked into A and B-rated schools on August 12th, 2025.


