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About Houston OEM



The City of Houston Office of Emergency Management (OEM) is responsible for coordinating mitigation, preparedness, response, and recover efforts for all emergency events within the city.

OEM develops partnerships, coordinates responses, and supports recovery efforts citywide.

In 2022 so far, the EOC has been activated for: Houston Marathon, Houston Rodeo, NRA Convention, Severe weather events, MLK events, Extreme Heat, and monitored several other events that have taken place. In 2021 we activated over ten times for several events.

EMERGENCY PLANS

YOUR PLAN

- How will you communicate?
- What is your evacuation route?
- Practice your plan
- Pay attention to local guidance about **updated** plans for evacuations and shelters, including for your pets.



PREPARING YOUR HOME

- Install safety features (smoke detectors, carbon monoxide, etc.)
- Post emergency numbers in plain view.
- Know how and when to turn off utilities.
- Understand that your planning may be different this year because of the need to protect yourself and others from COVID-19.



EMERGENCY KIT ITEMS

GO BAG

- Copies of your important papers
 - First aid kit
 - Radio with extra batteries
 - Toiletries / clothes / blankets
 - Feminine Hygiene products
- Food & Water (7-day supply for each person in your household)
 - Cash
- Include items that can help protect you and others from COVID-19:
 - Hand sanitizer
 - Bar or liquid soap
 - Cloth face coverings per person
- Medications (prescriptions should have a 5-day supply)
 - Special Care Items
 - Infant formula and diapers if applicable
- Pet safety kit, immunization records, leash or collar, microchip information



BE INFORMED

ALERT SYSTEMS



- AlertHouston- delivers critical information to Houston residents regarding current conditions, expected impacts, and protective actions to keep themselves and their loved ones safe.
- Register for emergency alerts through email, text message, voice call, or mobile app push notification. Free program but you must register.

STATE OF TEXAS EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE REGISTRY

Who should register?

- • People with Disabilities
- • People with access and functional needs such as:
 - – People with limited mobility
 - – People who have communication barriers
 - – People who require additional medical assistance during an emergency event
 - – People who require transportation assistance
 - – People who require personal care assistance

STATE OF TEXAS EMERGENCY ASSISTANCE REGISTRY (STEAR)

Do you or anyone you know need some form of assistance during times of an emergency/disaster event? The state of Texas offers Texans the option to register with the STEAR program, a FREE registry that provides local emergency planners and responders with additional information on the needs in their community.

(Texas communities use the registry information in different ways. Registering yourself in the STEAR registry DOES NOT guarantee that you will receive a specific service during an emergency. Available services will vary by community. For more information on how your community will use information in the STEAR registry, contact your local emergency management office.)

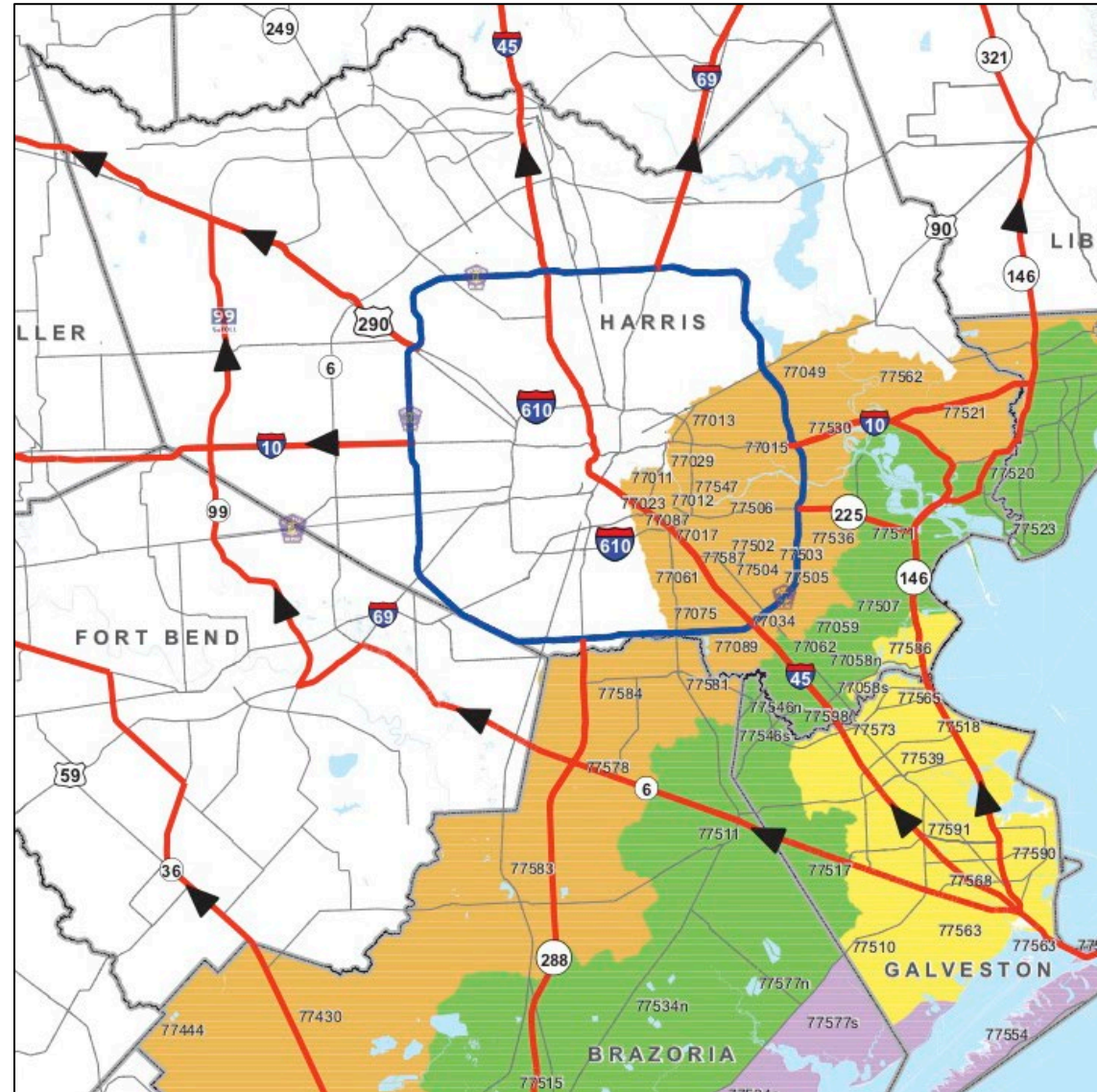
We currently have 7,158 registrants

AFTER THE DISASTER - RECOVERY

- Returning Home
 - Wait for official instructions to return.
 - Be prepared to be without basic utilities and services for some time.
 - Disasters can cause damage to homes and create safety hazards.
 - Discard all food that has been left unrefrigerated or has been damaged.
 - You should continue to use preventive actions like washing your hands and wearing a face covering during clean up or when returning home.
- Assistance
 - Depending on the size and scale of the emergency, some disaster assistance may be available from FEMA and other agencies.
 - Check with these agencies and community organizations for assistance.
 - Dealing with disasters can cause stress and strong emotions, particularly during the COVID-19 pandemic. Getting help when you need it will help you, your family, and your community recover.
