

DISASTER PREPAREDNESS PARTNERSHIPS

- 1) Tool access for each District
 - a. ToolBank maintains a reserved inventory of 1162 tools across 110 types
 - Tool types include generators, ac units, chainsaws, muck & gut kits and more
 - b. Districts have full access to the ToolBank's inventory, on a first-come, first-served basis
- 2) Deploy tools for disaster response and recovery needs
 - a. If advance notice of storm, ToolBank pre-positions tools at Disaster Hubs in each district 3-5 days before landfall
 - b. If no advance notice, ToolBank positions tools ASAP
 - c. ToolBank will supplement and/or replace tools as needs change throughout the recovery process
 - d. After recovery needs ends, ToolBank will inventory, repair and store tools to prepare for the next event

Hurricane Beryl Response

- 1) Distributed tools as fast as possible after event
- 2) Shared >\$226K worth of tools (3847 individual tools) across 43 responding organizations:
 - Support volunteer reception centers, cooling centers and food distribution sites.
 - Provide power and heat relief.
 - Provide debris removal support for cleanup efforts.
 - Complete home repairs, including roof tarping and tree removals.
- 3) Supporting ongoing recovery

Along with 38 other entities, including: City of Sugarland, CrowdSource Rescue, Memorial Assistance Ministries Project Row Houses, Rosenberg Library, YWCA and more.


Partnership Activity & Impact

Shared 4,960 tools valued at \$332,945 since 2021 with Council District partners

 Includes reserved tools, as well as tools from our full inventory

Shared an additional 4,060 tools valued at \$56,106 with other City offices

- We partner with both the Department of Neighborhoods, since 2018, and the Solid Waste Management Department, since 2021.
- Tools are used in support of community cleanups, youth volunteer days, holiday events, and more.



Partnership Activity & Impact

- Active disaster response for the Derecho, Hurricane Beryl, and minor events such as heat relief needs in the summer account for 25% of activity.
- Lot clearing, debris removal, mow downs and other community cleanup projects account for 46% of activity.
 - This is a critical step to take during blue skies to minimize damage during a wind or flooding event.
- Community resource fairs, back to school events, job fairs and other community events account for 29% of activity.
