Process

- Residents report illegal dumpsites to 311.
- DON or HPD investigate.
- Once investigation is complete, an abatement order is issued.
- SWMD collects once transferred to SWMD queue.



Ongoing Collection

- Crews collect as a part of normal heavy trash and green waste collection operations as they are available.
- Designated areas may be collected as part of neighborhood projects.
- Sweeps performed when there is supplemental funding such as state or federal grants (Zika or West Nile).

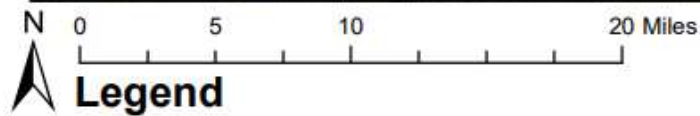
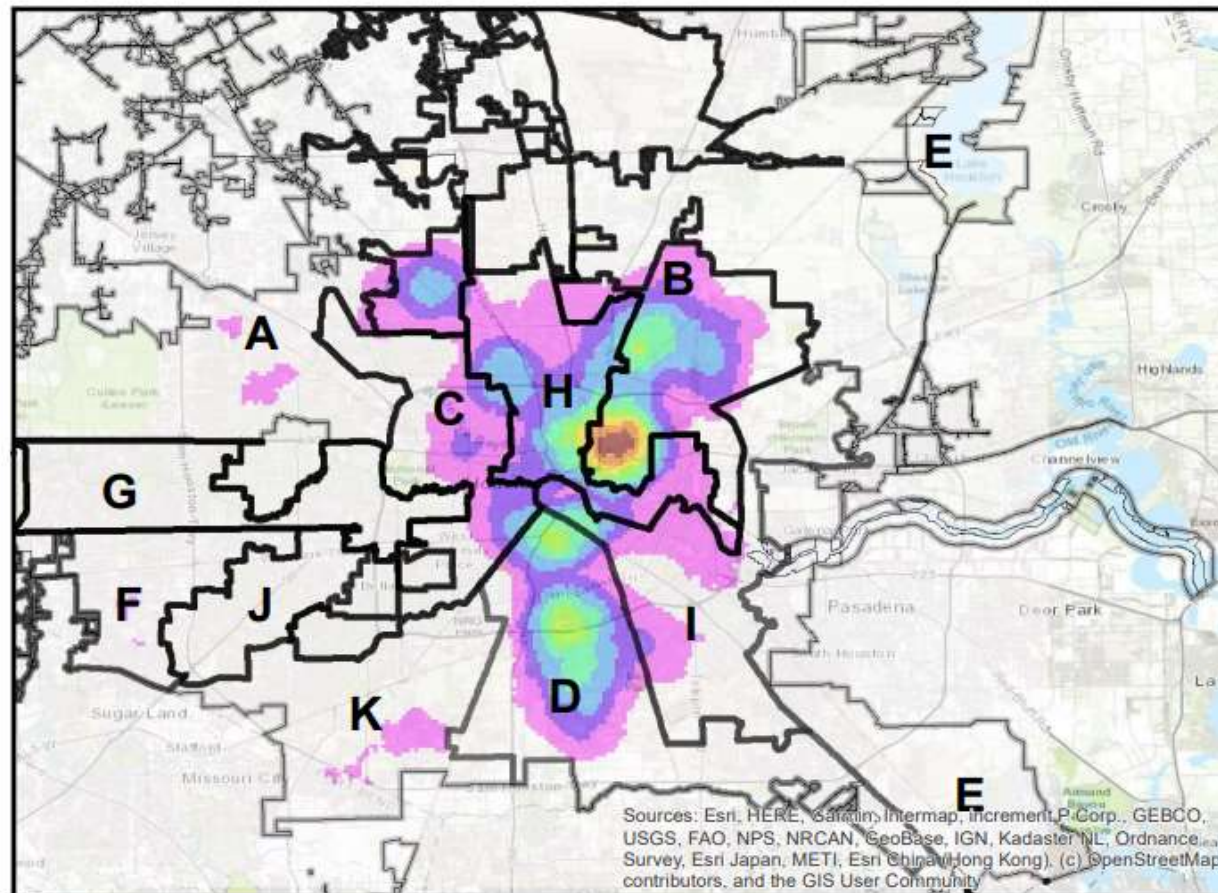

Abused Areas

- Council Districts B, D, H and I are most impacted by illegal dumping activity.
- Small contractors and residents within the area are most often the culprits.
- Poor lighting, vacant lots, open ditches and vacant/abandoned homes are high on the list of dumpsites.
