Background

☐ March 2016: fire in a boarding home and fire in an unlicensed
lodging facility resulted in three deaths and the emergency
evacuation of 29 elderly and disabled residents.
☐ In response, Mayor Turner formed an internal working group

Approved Regulatory Framework

☐ Four types of permits: ☐ Permits issued by HPW ☐ Boarding Home ☐ Lodging Facility ☐ Permits issued by ARA ☐ Correctional Facility ☐ Alternate Housing Facility ☐ Fees: ☐ All Facilities Annual Safety Inspection Fee = \$192.00 ☐ Boarding and Lodging Facility Permit Fees = \$81.00 ☐ Correctional and Alternate Housing Permit Fees = \$130.00 ☐ All fees over \$50 pay the Administrative Fee of \$29.84 ☐ Example: Lodging Facility would pay: \square (\$192.00+\$29.84)+(\$81.00+\$29.84) = \$332.68



Boarding Homes: General Information

- □ Definition: Facilities that provide lodging and personal care services to 3 or more persons with disabilities and/or elderly persons.
- ☐ 117 facilities were registered prior to the ordinance's passage in March 2018. Registered facilities had until October 1, 2019 obtain the new Boarding Home Permit.
- ☐ Authorization: State Law Health and Safety Code, Title 4, Subtitle B, Chapter 260, Boarding Home Facilities
- ☐ Enforced by both HPD Mental Health Unit and HPW Occupancy Section



Lodging Facilities: General Information

☐ Definition: Establishment that furnishes lodging to 3 or more
persons, who are unrelated to the owner of the establishment
by blood or marriage. The term "lodging facility" shall not
include: (1) a boarding home, (2) a hotel or bed and breakfast
facility, or (3) a single-family residential building
condominium, or townhouse that is owner-occupied for at least
three months of the year each year.

☐ Boarding houses
☐ Rooming houses
☐ Tenement houses
☐ Bunk houses
☐ Flop houses
☐ Does not include:
☐ Short-term rentals
☐ Vacation/rental homes
☐ Apartments, hotels, condos



Correctional & Alternate Housing Facilities: General Information

☐ Definitions:

- □ Correctional Facility A facility for the housing and rehabilitation or training of adults on parole, early or prerelease, or any other form of executive, judicial or administrative release from a penal institution
- □ Alternate Housing Facility A residence owned by an individual, private legal entity, non-profit or faith-based organization which is not owned by, operated by, established by or contracted with TDCJ where three or more unrelated parolees reside

By the Numbers – Annual Inspections

154 Boarding or Lodging Facilities are currently in process for either the annual safety inspection or inspections required to obtain the Certificate of Occupancy.
108 Annual Inspections were completed by HPW for the period of March 21, 2019 through June 30, 2020.
8 Annual Inspections are pending with HPW; meaning the location has either obtained the Certificate of Occupancy recently or the location is seeking the annual inspection for their permit renewal. Some delayed due to COVID19.
Annual inspections are conducted regardless of any Certificate of Occupancy inspections that may be required.

^{*} Locations may be required to obtain more than one type of facility permits based on classification of residents and services provided.



By the Numbers – 311 Calls


- # of 311 and Non-311 cases received in HPW/HPD from January 1, 2019 through June 30, 2020: **302**
- **HPW** metric: all 311 cases to be resolved and closed within **7** days of receipt.
 - ☐ The average days open is currently 2.90. This is 96.89% of the cases.
- HPD metric: all 311 cases to be resolved and closed within 15 days of receipt.
 - ☐ The average days open is currently 7.89. This is 92.31% of the cases.

Ongoing Compliance Procedures

- ☐ HPW works with HPD to visit previously registered Boarding Home locations for compliance with current ordinance provisions. Citations may be issued for failure to comply after 15-day notice is provided.
- ARA and HPW update the Residential Facilities webpage every Fridays to reflect new applications received or permits issued. The p o s t i n g i s l o c a t e d a t www.houstonpermittingcenter.org/residentialfacilities
- □ ARA and the City's legislative team worked on a bill last session that would require TDCJ to provide data on a monthly basis without a Public Information Request being filed. The bill was filed by Rep. Dutton (HB 1956). A similar bill was filed by Sen. Miles (SB 1848). ARA has put forth this item for the upcoming legislative session.
