Four Areas Evaluated for Calls for Service

- 1. Washington Avenue
- 2. Midtown
- 3. Upper Kirby
- 4. Richmond

Analysis of Calls for service from June 1, 2019 to September 30, 2020 showed 2,709 calls for service from the top locations in each area for calls. Washington had the most calls of all areas. The prevalent call types from the public are loud noise, disturbances, BMV's, assaults, thefts, and parking complaints.

HPD Responses Differential Response Teams

- Validate the Issue and gather information DRT Officers sent to scene, Sound Meter, CFS, HCAD, TABC, Health, Fire Marshal, Permits, Certificate of Occupancy.
- Meet with Business Owner, Conduct Inspections, Code Enforcement
- Problem Locations re-inspect with TABC, Health Dept, Fire Marshal
- Chapter 125 Notification of nuisance activity Part 1 and Part 2
 Crimes
- Educate community, bars and clubs on code enforcement
