## **Noise Complaints**

 Since TABC is a state agency, we do not possess the statutory authority to enforce city ordinances. (Texas Administrative Code § 101.62 was repealed.)



#### **Protests**

- Types of applications that can be protested:
  - Original
  - Reinstatement
  - Change of location
  - Renewal (only by public officials)



#### **Protests**

- Types of permits and licenses that can be protested:
  - Brewpub License (BP)
  - Mixed Beverage Permit (MB)
  - Private Club Registration Permit (N)
  - Retail Dealer's On-Premise License (BE)
  - Wine and Beer Retailer's Permit (BG)



## **Protest Policy Guidelines**

- If applicant is seeking a Food and Beverage Certificate (FB):
  - Application cannot be protested [Protest Policy 4.3 (c) (2)]
- If primary business is a "sexually-oriented business":
  - Application can be protested despite the FB and even if it's a renewal [Protest Policy 4.3 (c) (2)]



#### Who Can Protest?

- Citizens who live within 300 feet of the proposed premises (N/ MB/BP/BE/BG) unless the business also applies for a Food and Beverage Certificate (FB).
- Public officials can protest any type of application for any type of permit or license. These include:

\*Mayor \*County judge

\*City attorney \*City council member

\*Chief of police \*City marshal

\*Sheriff \*County/district attorney
