GOALS

- ensure multi-family structures meet minimum standards for habitability (Houston Code 2009-1043)
- perform programmatic inspections on 4-year cycle for 4500 properties
- respond to service requests within 7 days
- track violations + educate + correct + issue citations as needed



BY THE NUMBERS + TOP SERVICE REQUESTS



350 service requests monthly

1 no air conditioning (summer)



business day to make initial contact*
*some referred to Health or Police

2 no heat (winter)

3 holes in walls

4 no hot water

5 water leaks





PROGRAMMATIC INSPECTIONS

inspect 4500 complexes* over four years exterior inspection only

confirmation of Certificate of Occupancy

electrical


