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COUNCIL MEMBER THOMAS' INAUGURAL MOBILE CARE DAY BRIDGES THE GAP FOR HOUSTON'S UNHOUSED

HOUSTON, TX – This past weekend ahead of Resurrection Sunday, Council Member Tiffany D. Thomas hosted her inaugural Mobile Care Day—an initiative was developed in response to the growing need for accessible services among Houston's unhoused population.

Attendees received free toiletries, clean clothing, food, supportive services, hygiene and personal care items, and a safe place to refresh with mobile showers provided by the District F Office. By meeting immediate needs, the event established a foundation of trust that allowed our team to connect individuals to long-term supportive services, identification recovery, veteran benefits, and health.

Supported by a broad coalition of community partners and the District F Homelessness Task Force, the Mobile Care Day, held Saturday, April 4, 2026, from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m., in the parking lot of The Church Without Walls – Eldridge, successfully served 41 attendees, facilitating 19 showers and providing a safe space for guests to refresh. Beyond immediate hygiene, the initiative's impact was deepened through direct service engagement: 32 individuals were assisted by West Houston Assistance Ministries with coordinated entry screenings for housing, 16 guests received medical attention through Healthcare for the Homeless, and 25 residents were connected to benefit enrollment via ACCESS Harris County.

“This work is a reminder that effective housing policy starts with proximity,” said Council Member Tiffany D. Thomas. “When we meet people where they are, we see clearly that homelessness is often hidden in plain sight and that solutions require deep investment in wraparound services and intentional focus on underserved communities.”

Guests checked in through a streamlined intake process modeled after successful District F winter freeze outreach efforts, ensuring immediate access to mobile showers and hygiene services provided by the District F Office. To protect personal belongings and offer peace of mind, items were secured using a ticket-and-tag system while guests accessed care. Throughout

the event, a “passport” system tracked engagement across service stations, allowing the District F team to provide on-site case management and schedule follow-up appointments.

This event was curated to intentionally move neighbors from immediate relief to long-term stability by connecting them to supportive services and opportunity pathways with the following partners:

- WHAM, conducted coordinated entry screenings that began the process of connecting families to the housing queue
- Healthcare for the Homeless, ACCESS Harris County, and Texas Health & Human Services, offered health services and benefit enrollment
- Gulf Coast Barber College provided haircuts
- Dots Luxe Spa provided free pediatric care on-site
